Next year will see the introduction of another fund called the "Player Development Panel Assistance Programme" that will help with fund coaching, competition entry fees and travel costs for those on the journey to becoming elite.

It was a great privilege to watch elite player Anna Foster win The Flogas Irish Women's Amateur Championship in Woodbrook. She played in the R & A Womens' Amateur Championships held in Portmarnock where she played fantastically and got through to the Quarter-finals. She also represented Ireland in the European Ladies Team Championship in Spain just before making the big decision to turn Professional.



She narrowly missed the cut by one shot in the KPMG Irish Ladies Open. Anna has already achieved her 1st Professional Victory winning the 25th Maryland Womens' Open and has attained a European Ladies Tour card – how amazing is that!. Elm Park is so proud of Anna and have loved supporting her across all the events.

Another of our super talented young golfers is Emma Fleming who started her year by winning her maiden R&A Student Tour series in Portugal in February. Emma finished in the top 3 in The Flogas Irish Women's Amateur Championship and reached the matchplay stages in the R & A Women's Amateur tournament. She was also selected to represent Ireland in the European Ladies Team Championship and in October she retained her crown as the Irish Intervarsity Championship winner.

Rachael Mc Donnell is another young lady with amazing talent and was selected to play on the Leinster Women's Interprovincial in July. Rachael achieved 3rd place in the Dunlaoghaire Scratch Cup and along with many others on the Senior Cup Panel played in many Scratch Cups throughout Leinster. Many congratulations also to Alice Spani Molella, Jen O'Brien and Jane Conan who achieved placings in some of these tournaments.

Captain Simone along with all the Elm Park ladies are so proud of all these players and congratulate them on their fantastic achievements in 2024.
