#### 2022

As a result of this one of our new members, Amy O'Connor, won the Irish Kids Tour U10 Munster Tournament in July 2022. This year we participated in the newly introduced Golf Sixes Competition run by Golf Ireland. Elm Park were runners up in the South Leinster qualifiers and went on to play in the Leinster Finals in September. What an achievement by our youngest members.

Congratulations to Emma Fleming who was this year's Junior Golfer of the Year.

Our Student and Junior girls continue to shine. **Anna Foster** represented Ireland at the World Amateur Team Championships in Paris, The Women's Home Internationals in Ballyliffin and the European Team Championships in Wales. **Rachael McDonnell** represented Leinster on the victorious Leinster Women's Interprovincial Team. **Emma Fleming** represented Ireland at the Girls Home Internationals in Scotland, the Leinster U18 and Women's Inter-provincial Teams and she won the Leinster Girls Championship Matchplay. **Kate Fleming** represented Ireland U17 in October and **Sarah O'Brien** represented Leinster U18 Interprovincial Team. I think it's safe to say that the future of ladies' golf in Elm Park is in good hands!
